arryl Berg, wingback on coach Bill Boswell's Sunset League Championship eleven for 1968 and the player who took Westminster to the semi-finals of the "AAAA" Championships, won a split-nod as Southern California CIF "AAAA" Division Player of the Year, as members of Helms Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics met at Helms Hall last week to make their annual all-star football team selections.

Berg, toeheaded whirling dervish who gained over 1,000 yards in total offense during the year for coach Bill Boswell, received strong competition from El Rancho quarterback Randy Drake and Randy's like number from St. Paul, Rick Wise in the run for player of the year honors. When the final vote was counted, however, Berg won a majority of the 22-member board vote.

Coach Bill Boswell calls Berg "the best player I've ever been associated with in coaching...he can anything." Berg ran for 452 yards and a 7-yard average, caught 34 passes for 643 yards, was the club's top blocker and played fine defense. His total offense was 1,095 yards including rushing and pass receptions.

The Westminster Lions, boasting a perfect 7-0 Sunset League season, got to the semi-finals of the playoffs before going down 27-7 to El Rancho. Coach Boswell's crew defeated Compton 40-6 and Pasadena 34-14 in the tourney's first two rounds.

For having been named Southern California's "AAAA" Division Player of the Year Darryl Berg will be recipient of the Helms medallion award at the 32nd annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held at Helms Hall on Saturday morning, Jan. 25th at 10:30 a.m. All players named for all-star team honors will receive framed scroll awards from the Helms Board.

The selection of Berg as 1968 Player of the Year will come as a surprise in some quarters of Southern California there is no doubt. Co-Champions in the 1968 Playoffs, El Rancho and St. Paul, who battled to a 20-20 tie for the title both boasted top contenders for top-player honors. El Rancho's Randy Drake, QB supreme, accounted for 2,322 in total offense, passing for 17 TDs and running for 23 others. Jim Wise, who led St. Paul to a piece of the title in 1968, threw for over 1,700 yards and 16 TDs, notching 70% completions.

Three players, Sem Cunningham and George Fraser (1st team) and Isaac Curtis (2nd team) are repeaters from last year's "AAAA" teams.

BOB ADAMS, CANOGA PARK FULLBACK, PICKED AS TOP PERFORMER IN L.A. CITY FOOTBALL FOR '68

B ig Bob Adams, burly 6-foot, 200-pound Canoga Park fullback performing in a manner reminiscent of another great L.A. City power runner Hugh McElhenny, led his Canoga Park teammates to the 1968 Los Angeles City Football Championship and by so doing captured the hearts and the votes of the Helms Foundation's City Board of Football to be named "Player of the Year" in Los Angeles City football for the 1968 season.

Adams, in what must go down as one of the great ball carrying exhibitions in city playoff history, scored five touchdowns as he rocked and rolled over Poly for 248 yards in 32 carries. The Hunters' victory over Poly 34-27 gave Canoga Park its first ever grid championship and a quite respectible 10-1-1 record for the year. Coach Mathieson's Hunters actually finished second to Cleveland in West-Valley Loop play during the year (lost 33-14 in league title decider), but came back strong in the playoffs.

Canoga Park, with Adems and running mate Greg Done accounting for most of the damage (these boys ran off with 2,800 yards during the year between them), took care of Western League champion Westchester, 27-6; Marine Loop titlist and undefeated Gardena, 7-6; Southern League co-champ and undefeated Manual Arts, 14-13; and finally Poly in the playoff finale.

The selection of the 1968 All-Los Angeles City grid team saw three units selected on both offense and defense for the first time in board history. Last year, the city board changed its format to include both offensive and defensive units...two teams for each...but with so much talent available to the selectors the board felt that three units of both offense and defense would be advisable.

For the second year, Poly's Eric Shirley was named to the all-star squad as a kicker. Manfred Moore, on last year's first defensive unit, was a first team offense pick from San Fernando. Dennis Stewart of Poly and Tom Griswold of Westchester, named to this season's first defensive unit, were second team defense picks last year.
